<u>Item 4: Norfolk Retrofitting event discussion</u>	
Norfolk County Council Economic Development have approached the partnership about running a retrofitting for Norfolk Event similar to ones that have recently taken place in Suffolk and Essex. Graham Lock who ran these

The event usually takes place over 3 mornings, which provides the following benefits:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Networking with like-minded organisations • Market place through self-identification of actors that support the market place. <p>The partnership deferred the decision on whether to go forward with the proposed event until its June meeting, and requested more information about the benefits that had been delivered to the Suffolk Climate Change Partnership to enable a decision to be made.
